# Student Dress Code

## **Purpose**

Our school community supports a Student Dress Code because it promotes a safe and supportive teaching and learning environment by:

- 1. Allowing ready identification of our students at school and in public,
- 2. Eliminating the distraction of competition in dress and fashion,
- 3. Fostering a sense of belonging,
- 4. Developing mutual respect amongst students by minimising visible evidence of economic or social differences.

## **Expectation**

Our students are expected to attend and represent our school in correct uniform.

We encourage our students to wear their uniform with pride as they are representing themselves, their school, their family and their community.

We expect all adults in our school community to support and encourage our students to wear the full and correct uniform.

#### **Considerations**

Our Uniform Committee considered the following when developing this Student Dress Code:

- 1. Availability and affordability of items,
- 2. Functionality, durability and practicality of items,
- 3. Health and safety of students,
- 4. Anti-discrimination

Our school is an accredited 'Sun Smart School' with Queensland Cancer Council.

# **Uniform Shop**

The uniform shop is operated by an external provider. Uniforms can be purchased online via the School Locker website or in person on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings 8.30am – 10.30am.

### **Free Dress Days**

Free dress days will be organised by Student Leaders and advertised via email and Facebook. Clothing worn on free dress days must meet the following criteria:

- Must be sun safe e.g covered shoulders and midriffs
- No inappropriate logos, images, slogans or wording e.g alcohol/tobacco
- Safe footwear shoes must be enclosed; no thongs, high heels etc

Cosmetics	No makeup is permitted

Sun safety	Sunglasses for outdoor use only
	<ul> <li>Coloured sunscreen may be worn at sports carnivals</li> </ul>
	'Rashies' must be worn during outdoor water activities
Specialist Shirts	Senior, Music, and Sports House shirts are only to be worn on

# **Monitoring the School Uniform**

Regular, routine uniform checks are conducted by class teachers and Deputy Principals.

Should a family experience financial hardship affecting the wearing of the school uniform, the Deputy Principal or Principal should be contacted immediately and confidentially.

Any student with inappropriate items (e.g. jewellery) will be asked to put the items in their bag. Parents will be contacted for any further incidents involving a student not following the School Dress Code.

The following procedures may apply to students not complying with the School Dress Code:

- No Hat No Play, students must stay in an undercover area if they do not have a hat to wear.
- Not Sun Safe No Play, students must stay in an undercover area
- A detention may be issued for continuous non-compliance
- Attendance/participation in extra-curricular/representative school activities may be limited
